Current Scholarship Program Defined



- JSTOR is partnering with many university and scholarly society publishers to provide access to current journal issues on a redesigned JSTOR platform
- Fundamentally different from JSTOR back issues
 - Publishers set the price for current issues
 - Publisher, society, and journal branding will be stronger
 - Titles may be licensed individually or in collections
- Shared principles with publishers are paramount
 - Part of and servicing the scholarly community
 - Commitment to fair and sustainable models to support the widest possible dissemination of research
 - Efficient, and improved experience for researchers and students
- Program may include other types of content in the future



Motivating Factors



- Constituent Demand
 - Libraries 2006 survey
 - Faculty and users ITHAKA Faculty Surveys in '00, '03, '06, and '09
 - Publishers
- Value of Scale
 - Economy of technology using a single platform for delivery
 - Interdisciplinary content aggregation for libraries and users
- Response to Environment
 - Desire to maintain diverse publishing community
 - Drive to enhance user research efficiency
- Mission Imperative
 - Leverage community investment in JSTOR to build for tomorrow



Platform Changes for JSTOR



Change	Impact	
More Content Formats (full-text HTML, born-digital PDF)	Ability to present content in multiple formats serves specific journal/discipline needs	
Multimedia	Ability to deliver zoomable images, audio, video, GIS, etc.	
New Look & Feel	New design allows publishers stronger branding; evolves JSTOR into a more broad-based platform that can handle multiple content types well	
Content Provider Management Tools	Giving publishers tools to manage their own content (both journal and marketing) lays the groundwork for other forms of contributed content	
Open Search & Browse	Reveals existence of more content to users	



Benefits to Libraries




- Contribution to the Sustainability of Scholarly Literature
 - System-wide solutions vs. financial pressures; higher prices; risk of loss of scholarly output
- Reasonable and Transparent Pricing
 - Publishers set their pricing to achieve the widest possible access to research in sustainable ways
- Long-term preservation and post-cancellation access
 - All current journals preserved in Portico
 - Working with each publisher to honor and enhance current PCA agreements
- Reduce Administrative Churn
 - A single license for both current and back issues saves time, money, and aggravation.
- Fuel Discovery
 - Adding current content to the platform will make it easier for your users to discover and access this material.
- Enhance 'Evidence Based Collection Management'
 - Meaningful Counter-compliant usage statistics for the full run of a title from a single, easy-to-use resource

Offering to Libraries: Maximum Choice and Flexibility



Single Title Options

- Current issues only or
- Full run of issue (current plus archived content)

Collection Options - Defined and custom collections

- Defined collections of current journals will align to JSTOR back issue collections.
 - Ex. Arts & Sciences I Current
 Arts & Sciences I Full run
- Custom collections can be created for institutions for any combination of titles.
 - Ex. CALIS Collection
- The fee for these collections will be the sum total of the fees for the titles in that collection, and be set by the publishers

Timeline



Spring 2010: **Build awareness** of the Current

Scholarship Program in the library

community

June/July 2010: Publish 2011 title list with prices;

begin taking orders for 2011

subscriptions

January 1, 2011: Access via JSTOR platform begins



New Collections



- Business III Collection (April 19, 2010)
 - 10% AAF savings for those that have *both* Business I Collection & Business II Collection
 - Minimum of 50-60 titles by 2013
 - Economics, business administration, finance
- Arts & Sciences IX Collection (Fall, 2010)
 - Area Studies such as Asian studies and African studies, population studies and geography
 - Half of the Business III titles will also be included
 - Minimum of 140 titles at completion
